#### Oral History Interviews:

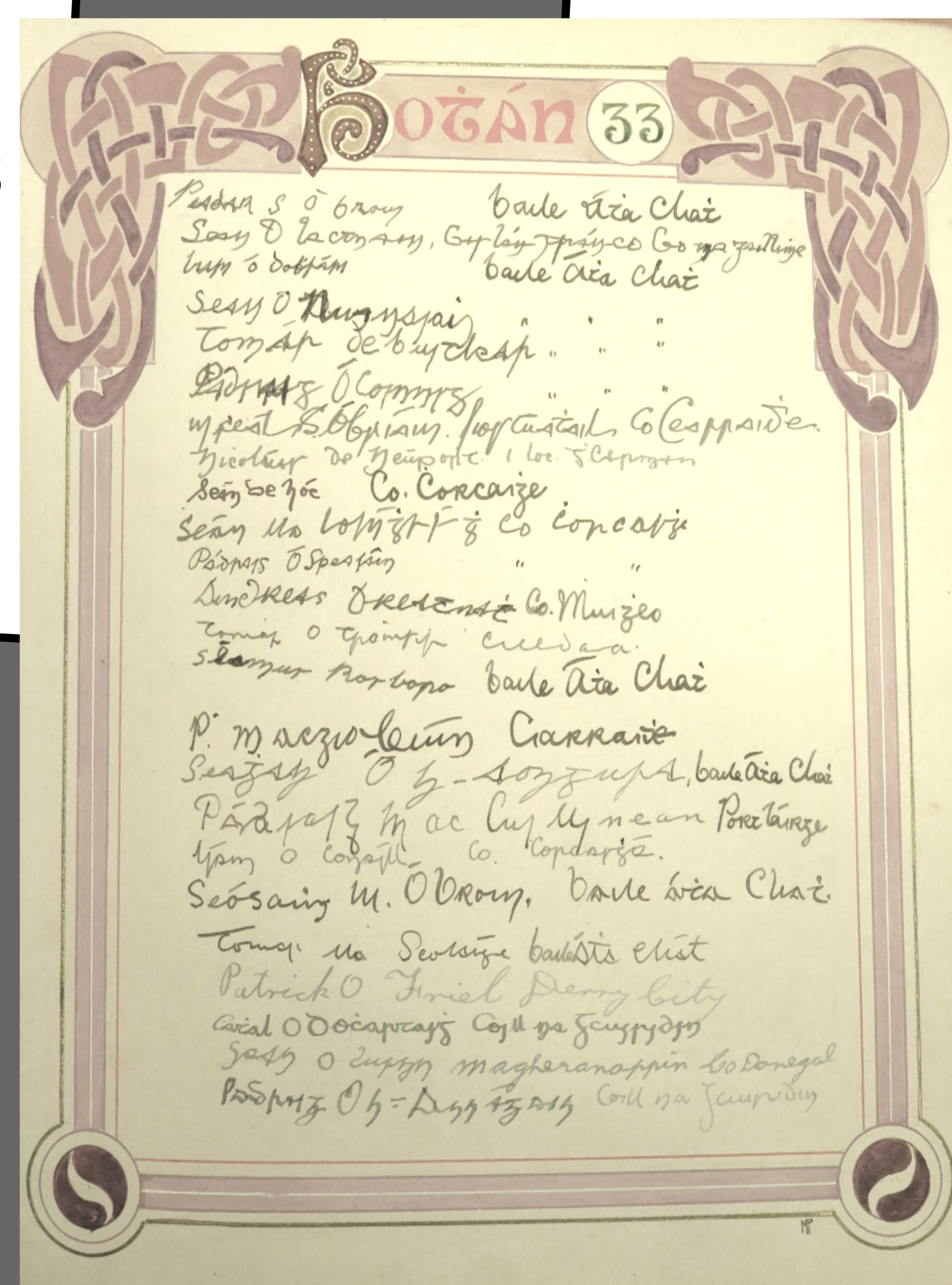
